

SALT RIVER DISTRICT DISTRICT COMMITTEE - EAGLE PROJECT REVIEW

These are the typical questions that a Prospective Eagle Scout will be asked at the District Committee review of his Eagle Scout Project proposal. Be ready to answer these and possibly other additional questions.

Typically Troop 278 Troop Committee Eagle Project reviews will focus on at least these same questions.

1. Why did you decide on the project?
2. How did you find out about the project?
3. When do you expect to do the project?
4. Do you have to earn money for the project?
5. How are you going to raise the money?
6. How are you going to get the crew to help you?
7. How many man hours (include your plan & prep) will it take to complete the project?
8. How are you going to provide for the comfort and safety of your crew?
9. Who will be supplying the tools?
10. Will any power tools be used?
11. Do you expect to complete the project in one-day?
12. How many scouts and adults do you plan to use for the project?
13. Are you going to feed your crew?
14. How are you going to demonstrate your leadership?
15. Do you have a 'Plan-B'?

The review typically starts at 7 p.m. and is based on a first come first serve basis. Arrive early (6:30 p.m.) to avoid a long wait. A troop committee member needs to introduce you to the person reviewing your project. You will have to write by hand a brief summary on a Eagle Project Approval form. Be sure to get a signature from the person who did the review on your signature page and the Eagle Project Approval form. Turn in the Eagle Project Approval form to the leader in charge at the table in the foyer.
